The Education Challenge – Preparing Students for a Changing World

The world in which today's students will live and work is being changed dramatically by four mega trends. Those mega trends are new and emerging technology, globalization, changing demographics, and new generations of young people in our classrooms. Dr. Daggett presents vivid examples of changes occurring in each of these areas. He then explains the skills and knowledge students will need to succeed in this changing world.

Developing 21st Century Literacy in Students

Literacy is the most critical skill needed in the 21st century. As society is pushed by constantly changing technology, individuals need to read and write at higher levels than in the past. Our literacy efforts in schools must include more than the traditional emphasis on prose, however. Quantitative literacy and functional literacy are becoming increasingly important. Dr.

Daggett explains the need to intensify our literacy requirements in all three areas and shares the most successful practices in moving all students to higher literacy levels.

Dr. Daggett outlines the impact of these changes and announces a major initiative related to the integration of academic and career-technical education.
